The Road to Preserving our Past

March 2025

The last couple of years have been transformative for the Historical Society. Through life events, several key persons to the organization have left us and some restructuring of the Society has

been required. A new Board of Directors has been assembled to build our roadmap to the future.

The focus of our plan has centered around several key points: establishing a database to organize and digitize our archives, recording and preserving our oral history, creating a YouTube channel for community access, and

forming a Building and Grounds committee to prioritize projects.

To achieve our archive goal, we would like to thank **The Befesa Community Fund**, who recognized our need and awarded the Society a grant to procure the equipment necessary for their preservation. We recently purchased

and setup the computer hardware and an overhead scanner dedicated to books and magazines including significant NJ Zinc Company publications dating back to its inception. Additionally, a large flat-

bed scanner was purchased for newspapers and photos that are rapidly deteriorating. It is our long term goal to create a visitor friendly Heritage Center experience where the public is able to access the database to answer questions about the past.

Phase 2 of this project involves creating a record of the remaining oral history of the area. If you have attend-

ed any of our recent programs, you may have noticed the programs being recorded. Over time, all programs, with the presenter's permission, will be recorded and available to be viewed on our YouTube channel. This will make our rich history readily available from any location. In the beginning of 2024, the Little White Church was in the need of some TLC. The Church received an overall cleaning, including a cleanout of the basement. Additionally, some repairs were needed to ensure it's continued use. A new furnace was installed, repair was made to the slate roof, and masonry work was done to the foundation and rear of the church. Also, work began to clean some of the headstones in the cemetery (see photos below), a new landscaping company was hired and two Ginkgo Biloba trees were planted along Columbia Avenue to replace those taken down with disease.
